1. **Cuestiones Económicas**

The Central Bank of Ecuador's research journal, *Cuestiones Económicas* (Economic Questions), extends an invitation to all economics professionals, researchers, professors and students, to submit papers presented at the Conference of the International Association for Feminist Economics. These will be considered for publication in Volume 31 (2), which will include a special section on "The Economy and Gender." Articles will be subject to blind peer review and must comply with the usual quality standards for international publications, as well as the editorial policy of the journal. The deadline for submitting papers is August 15, 2021; it is expected that this issue will be published in December, 2021. Research papers can be submitted in either Spanish or English, and if accepted, will be published in the language of submission. Mundos Plurales, Latin American Journal of Policy and Public Action, invites you to submit papers from the 29th Annual Congress of the International Association for Feminist Economics. The journal is a forum for researchers to contribute to the development and dissemination of theoretical and methodological reflections focused on the analysis and evaluation of policies and public action, particularly based on the experience of Latin America. It publishes the results of research drawing on qualitative and/or quantitative analysis, with special interest in studies carried out from a critical, comparative, inter- and transdisciplinary perspective that contribute to the construction of plural public policies. The journal will receive conference papers until August 31 2021. These must comply with the editorial policy and the rules for submitting original articles ([Here](#)). By opening new areas of economic inquiry, welcoming diverse voices, and encouraging critical exchanges, the journal enlarges and enriches economic discourse. The goal of *Feminist Economics* is not just to develop more illuminating theories but to improve the conditions of living for all children, women, and men. *Feminist Economics* publishes papers of high quality that do most or all of the following:

- Make an important contribution to feminist economic scholarship and engage with feminist ideas, consistent with the journal's general call for papers;
- Build upon and adequately reference the appropriate literatures;
- Are oriented to the journal's international audience;
- Present clearly the core arguments and methodology and where appropriate, adhere to the journal's policy on statistical reporting;
- Are clearly and concisely written and accessible both to economists and to scholars in related fields who are concerned with economic issues.

Submissions should be in English. However, *Feminist Economics* is willing to conduct a preliminary evaluation of articles in Spanish and French, provided appropriate reviewers are available. After preliminary evaluation, those authors who are encouraged to submit papers for full peer review will be asked to submit their papers in English.
